



Hadrian's Wall Trek, Great Britain

Hadrian's Wall in Northumbria is a spectacular testament to the Romans and their many incredible feats of engineering. The wall spanned from coast to coast for 72 miles keeping out the Picts of Caledonia who proved a nuisance as they raided towns and villages in the north of England.

With only sections of the wall still remaining, Hadrian's wall has been designated a World Heritage Site and your challenging trek over two days will cover 25 miles of the wall and take in the ancient monuments and breathtaking views of the wall itself.

Day 1: Haltwhistle

You will arrive late afternoon at our base for the weekend, a nice campsite just outside the small town of Haltwhistle.

Arriving at the campsite you will have your evening meal, safety brief for the challenge and the chance to get to know everyone else on the challenge, before commencing on your exploration of Hadrian's Wall in the morning.

Day 2: Lanercost Priory to Haltwhistle - 24km

After a hearty breakfast to set you up for the day you will hop on our transport with your kit and packed lunch for the transfer to the starting point at Lanercost Priory.

The first part of the day will see the group walk down a quiet road that passes through some picturesque villages before joining a ridge line that runs alongside Hadrian's Wall.

After a while, we will arrive at the impressive Birdoswald Roman Fort which sits above the village of Gilsland.

From here you will follow a path that takes the group into Northumberland National Park and our lunch break at the Roman Army Museum. In the afternoon, after lunch you trek along some of the most visible sections of the wall which have amazing cliff tops and stunning scenery as a backdrop.

Completing your long day's walk will see you arrive back at the campsite for a much needed rest and hot meal.

Day 3: Haltwhistle to Brocolitia (17km up to 7 hours)

An early start and breakfast await you after a night under canvass. Setting out from camp we will rejoin the ridge and carry on along the wall where your journey ended the day before.

Heading further east your route will give you amazing views of Wark forest and the barren landscape that is North Northumberland.

Passing along crags and lakes you will head towards Housestead Roman Fort, which is where we will stop for lunch.

After lunch there are a few more hours of walking before completing your challenge by finishing at



Brocolitia. With a real sense of satisfaction there will be time for a final few photographs capturing the moment you completed your Hadrian's Wall trek before being transported back to camp to pack up and head home after a memorable weekend!
